MUSIC NOTES:

~ "A Mighty Fortress" was written (hymn, text and tune) by Martin Luther in 1529, based on Psalm 46. It soon became the rallying cry of the Protestant Reformation. By 1900, over 80 translations were being used, and today there are more than 200 versions in common usage.

~ "Nearer, My God, To Thee" is a 19-century hymn by Sarah Flower Adams, an English poet and Unitarian hymn writer (1805-1848). It is based loosely on Genesis 28:11-19 (the story of Jacob's dream). The hymn is well-known, among other uses, as the alleged last song the band on *RMS Titanic* played before the ship sank.

~ Today's final hymn was written in Latin by John Francis Wade in the mid-1700's. For many years the authorship of the hymn was questioned, but in 1946 an English vicar discovered a manuscript of the hymn signed by Wade. **HAPPY ANNIVERSARY!** Today is the 241st anniversary of the date that colonists met at this Meeting House and "declared for American Independence." (*Thank you to Dennis Rydberg for noting this.*)
