~ ABOUT TODAY'S HYMNS ~

- ↑ The tune of our opening hymn "Holy God, We Praise Your Name" is GROSSER GOTT, WIR LOBEN DICH. As was the German practice, it received its name from the first line of the poem (published in 1774).
- J "Jesus Calls Us" was written by Cecil Frances Alexander, born in Tyrone County, Ireland in 1823. She excelled as a writer for children, and is said to have written nearly 400 hymns and poems. Other well- known hymns include "Once in Royal David's City" and "There Is a Green Hill Far Away.
- ↑ The text of our closing hymn was written by Welshman William Williams (1717-1791), who was ordained a deacon in the Church of England in 1740. He was identified with the Calvinist Methodist movement and traveled throughout Wales preaching. He wrote more than 800 hymns in Welsh and another 100 in English.
