#### FIRST LESSON – Isaiah 65:17-25

<sup>17</sup> For I am about to create new heavens and a new earth;  
the former things shall not be remembered or come to mind.  
<sup>18</sup> But be glad and rejoice forever in what I am creating;  
for I am about to create Jerusalem as a joy, and its people as a  
delight. <sup>19</sup> I will rejoice in Jerusalem, and delight in my people;  
no more shall the sound of weeping be heard in it, or the cry of  
distress. <sup>20</sup> No more shall there be in it an infant that lives but a few  
days, or an old person who does not live out a lifetime;  
for one who dies at a hundred years will be considered a youth,  
and one who falls short of a hundred will be considered accursed.  
<sup>21</sup> They shall build houses and inhabit them; they shall plant vineyards  
and eat their fruit. <sup>22</sup> They shall not build and another inhabit; they  
shall not plant and another eat; for like the days of a tree shall the  
days of my people be, and my chosen shall long enjoy the work of  
their hands. <sup>23</sup> They shall not labor in vain, or bear children for  
calamity; for they shall be offspring blessed by the LORD—and their  
descendants as well. <sup>24</sup> Before they call I will answer, while they are  
yet speaking I will hear. <sup>25</sup> The wolf and the lamb shall feed together,  
the lion shall eat straw like the ox; but the serpent—its food shall be  
dust! They shall not hurt or destroy on all my holy mountain,  
says the LORD.

#### SECOND LESSON – I Corinthians 15:20-28

<sup>20</sup> But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of  
those who have died. <sup>21</sup> For since death came through a human  
being, the resurrection of the dead has also come through a human  
being; <sup>22</sup> for as all die in Adam, so all will be made alive in  
Christ. <sup>23</sup> But each in his own order: Christ the first fruits, then at his  
coming those who belong to Christ. <sup>24</sup> Then comes the end, when he  
hands over the kingdom to God the Father, after he has destroyed  
every ruler and every authority and power. <sup>25</sup> For he must reign until  
he has put all his enemies under his feet. <sup>26</sup> The last enemy to be  
destroyed is death. <sup>27</sup> For “God<sup>l</sup> has put all things in subjection under  
his feet.” But when it says, “All things are put in subjection,” it is plain  
that this does not include the one who put all things in subjection  
under him. <sup>28</sup> When all things are subjected to him, then the Son  
himself will also be subjected to the one who put all things in  
subjection under him, so that God may be all in all.
