~ About Today's Hymns ~

~ "All People That on Earth Do Dwell" is a metrical version of Psalm 100 by William Kethe, published in the Anglo-Genevan Psalter in 1561. In the original text, stanza 1, line 3, read "him serve with fear" but the Scottish psalter (1650) changed the word "fear" to "mirth" because the biblical psalm contains the phrase "Serve the Lord with gladness." The tune was composed or adapted by Louis Bourgeois in 1551. In 1562 the tune was associated with Kethe's text and the two have been linked ever since, hence the name OLD HUNDREDTH.

~ "Trust and Obey" was written by John Sammis (1846-1919). Born in Brooklyn, he was converted to Christianity at age 22, and later was ordained as a Presbyterian minister. He wrote the chorus lines first and then five stanzas. The tune was composed by Daniel Towner, and of its origins it is written: "Mr. Moody (Dwight L.) was conducting a series of meetings in Brockton, MA (in 1886) and I had the pleasure of singing for him there. One night a young man rose in a testimony meeting and said, 'I am not quite sure, but I am going to trust and I am going to obey.' I jotted that sentence down and sent it with the little story to the Rev. John Sammis.

~ Both the German text and the musical setting of our closing hymn were composed by Georg Neumark (1621-1681). He was court poet, librarian, and registrar to Duke Wilhelm II. He became blind during his last months of life. The tune WER NUR DEN LIEBEN GOTT was used in eight of J.S. Bach's cantatas as well as in choral and organ settings.
