# About Today's Hymns

☐ "Let All Things Now Living" (#554) was written/composed by Katherine Davis for the tune ASH GROVE in the 1920s. Davis (1892-1980) published nearly 800 separate items, primarily choral pieces and arrangements, and was active as a composer until 1977. ASH GROVE is a Welsh folk melody. ☐ "All Who Love and Serve Your City" (#413) was written by Erik Routley in 1966, as his first hymn text. He was asked to compose a piece of music and began thinking about the Oakland, CA riots. This hymn text was the result. The tune CHARLESTOWN is an American folk melody published in 1799. ☐ "Live Into Hope" (#332) was written by Jane Parker Huber (b. 1926) for United Presbyterian Women's National Meeting at Purdue Univ. in July 1976. It is based on Luke 4:16-20 (N.T., p. 61). The worship team asked for a hymn that expounded the Luke passage - that is written in inclusive language, that raises one's spirits even in difficult situations, and is familiar enough to be sung with enthusiasm when first heard. Huber sensed TRURO to be a perfect vehicle for the words "Live Into Hope," and wrote her first hymn (with twelve stanzas originally). The composer of TRURO (you may know as the tune of "Lift Up Your Heads") is uncertain, but the harmonization is by Lowell Mason (1792-1872), whose music library resides at Yale University.
